Whale Watch

We are pleased to tell you that we needed to reserve two boats to accommodate all the people who want to join us for our annual whale watching trip. The first boat leaves the pier at Port Allen at 9:00 AM and the second boat at 11:00 AM. Grades K-8 and their guests will be going on the first boat (9:00 AM) The high school students, their guests, and the remainder of

our guests will be going on the second boat (11:00 AM). We will be using school vehicles for students going on the first boat. Parents and guests will need to provide their own transportation. If we have any available seats on the buses going to the first boat, we will be happy to fill them on a first come, first serve basis (donations for gas would be greatly appreciated.) There will be no buses available for the second boat trip.

To get to the harbor, take Highway 50 west through Kalaheo and Eleele. Take a left at the light (there is a McDonald's on the opposite corner) just before continuing down the hill into Hanapepe. There is parking on the right at the end of the road just before entering the harbor area.

Everyone who goes on the whale watch must sign a "permission" slip provided by Na Pali Explorers. This form was sent home with each student on Tuesday, March 3rd. If you are not a student or you lost your copy, you can obtain a form from the school office or go on-line to our web site and download a copy.
